YOUTH EDUCATION PROGRAM (YEP)

Inadequate school infrastructure and learning materials hinder academic performance of youth in rural Ghana, inhibiting their future possibilities. GHEI's YEP addresses this challenge by improving quality of education for Junior High School (JHS) students, enabling them to attend Senior High School (SHS) and pursue better opportunities!

HOW DOES YEP WORK?

YEP offers supplemental classes to JHS students in Humjibre village, Ghana. The classes have a significantly smaller student to teacher ratio than regular schools, have a variety of materials and resources that are not commonly available, and focus on active learning and thinking skills, while helping students prepare for their critical Basic Education Certification Examination (BECE)*.

Since 2013, all YEP students have passed BECE and over 50% have achieved high passing scores, indicating excellent performance.
