

In response to COVID-19, Ghana Health and Education Initiative (GHEI), in partnership with One Day's Wages, has launched **Safe Villages**, **Ghana**, a 12-month initiative (May 2020 - June 2021) dedicated to preparing villages for the health, educational, and economic consequences they may face as a result of the pandemic. The programme works in collaboration with local health officials and our partners in the Bibiani-Anwiaso-Bekwai (BAB) Municipality of Ghana,

OUR COMMUNITIES

GHEI is based in Humjibre Village in the BAB Municipality of Ghana's Western North Region. Our catchment communities boast lush forests, cocoa plantations, bustling markets and vibrant local cultures. Majority of the people work as farmers, primarily of cocoa and plantain.

Unfortunately, our communities are also home to poverty. The level of education is low, and the population is far from proper health facilities. Young people have little or no access to vocational trainings. While worsening the development & health challenges, COVID-19 has directly affected the livelihoods of many, as they are unable to sell their produce due to 'market days' restrictions. Moreover, misinformation related to COVID-19 is fueling skepticism about the disease, and the growing spate of stigmatization is a major concern.

OUR APPROACH

Our approach is informed by GHEI's expertise in public health work & lessons learned. The overall goal is to save lives by providing life-saving info, services & provide continuous learning to students even with schools closed.



Delivered 135 announcements in all 15 villages
